RESOLUTION NO. 01 2004

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING ARKANSAS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 2

WHEREAS, the public policy decisions of the Arkansas Legislature impact every citizen of the state, both private and corporate, and ultimately determine to a great extent the level of prosperity and achievement enjoyed by Arkansas citizens; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas lacks the necessary economic incentive component to successfully locate an economic development super project in the state; and

WHEREAS, the inability to adequately fund the infrastructure related costs associated with a super project in Arkansas creates a competitive disadvantage in economic expansion, and other southern states have enjoyed the economic benefits of locating a super project resulting in the loss of opportunity for economic development and expansion in Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the location of an super project creating a minimum of 500 jobs with a capital investment of \$500,000,000 will increase the quality of life for the citizens of Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, super projects require large up-front commitment of funds for infrastructure such as water/wastewater capacity, rail access, and connection of roads to interstate highways and utilities; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Legislature has wisely offered the Arkansas electorate the opportunity at the November 2004 general election to amend the Arkansas Constitution to allow the Arkansas General Assembly, meeting in regular or special session, the authority to approve general obligation bonds, not to exceed five percent (5%) of state general revenues, to fund an economic development project investing a minimum of five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000) and creating a minimum of five hundred (500) jobs.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CEDARVILLE:


That the Cedarville City Council and its members endorse and support the proposed Amendment 2 to the Arkansas Constitution; and

That the Cedarville City Council authorizes the Arkansas Economic Developers to use our name while supporting the cause of Amendment 2 during the campaign.

RESOLUTION NO. 2005-1A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE WILLINGNESS
OF THE CITY OF Cedarville
TO COOPERATE IN A PROGRAM REGARDING
WARNING SIGNS AT BRIDGES

WHEREAS, the 1978 Surface Transportation Assistance Act allows participating Federal-Aid funds for the erection of warning signs at public highway bridges that are limited by weight, and

WHEREAS, there may be bridges under the City's jurisdiction that should have warning signs placed regarding weight limit restrictions, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City to comply with the National Bridge Inspection Standards as administered by the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) and described in the manual entitled "Local Government Procedures for Compliance With The National Bridge Inspection Standards", hereafter referred to as the "Local Government Compliance Manual", and

WHEREAS, this program has been approved by the AHTD and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for the installation of the necessary load limit signs, funded in part with City funds and part with Federal funds, and

WHEREAS, this Resolution supersedes all previous agreements regarding reimbursement for the installation of warning signs at bridges with restrictive weight limits,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City intends to participate in this program as explained in the "Local Government Compliance Manual".
2. As the City installs the load limit sign(s) at the bridge locations designated by the AHTD and in accordance with the specifications stated in the "Manual On Uniform Traffic Control Devices", the AHTD will bill the City for twenty percent (20%) of the material costs. The City agrees to pay one hundred percent (100%) of the material costs if the installation and written notification is not made within one month from the date of material requisition.
3. The City may obtain bridge weight limit signing materials from the AHTD not only for initial posting, but also for replacement signing or altered load limit signing.
4. Upon completion of the sign installation, the City will maintain the sign(s).
5. The City agrees to return to the AHTD an annual certification agreement regarding bridge posting and closing status. As a supplement to this certification agreement, the AHTD will provide to the City a current list of bridges requiring posting or closing for verification and return to the AHTD.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, certain areas of City of Cedarville, are subject to periodic
(community name)
flooding, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Council to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in areas having these hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to the Legislature of the State of Arkansas in Ark. Code Ann. § 14-268-101 et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that his Council hereby:

1. Assures the Federal Emergency Management Agency that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force, in those areas having flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in Section 60 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
2. Vests the Mayor or his Designee with the responsibility, authority and means
(designate agency or official)
to:
 - (a) Assist the Administrator, at his/her request, in the delineation of the limits of the area having special flood hazards.
 - (b) Provide such information concerning present uses and occupancy of the floodplain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow) or flood-related erosion areas as the Administrator may request.
 - (c) Maintain for public inspection and furnish upon request, for the determination of applicable flood insurance risk premium rates within all areas having special flood hazards identified on a Flood Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), any certificates of floodproofing, and information on the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the level of the lowest flood (including basement) of all new construction or substantially improved structures, and include whether or not such structures contain a basement, and if the structure has been floodproofed, the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was floodproofed.

- (d) Cooperate with Federal, State and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map and identify floodplain, mudslide (i.e., mudflow) or flood-related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain, mudslide, (i.e., mudflow) and/or flood-related erosion areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- (e) Upon occurrence, notify the Administrator in writing whenever the boundaries of the community have been modified by annexation or the community has otherwise assumed or no longer has authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area. In order that all FHBM's and FIRM's accurately represent the community's boundaries, include within such notification a copy of the map of the community suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating the new corporate limits or new area for which the community has assumed or relinquished floodplain management regulatory authority.
- (f) Submit an annual report to the Administrator concerning the community's participation in the program, including, but not limited to the development and implementation of floodplain management measures.
3. Appoints the Mayor or his Designee
(designate agency or official)
with the responsibility, authority, and means to implement the commitments as outlined in this Resolution.
4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the adopted floodplain management measures.
