CITY OF CEDARVILLE CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES April 17, 2018

The regular monthly City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Mark Isenhower after he declared that a quorum was present. A moment of silence was followed by the pledge of allegiance. Council members present were Alderman Johnson, Alderman Odom, Alderman McClendon and Alderman Breshears.

A motion to approve the March regular monthly meeting minutes was made by Alderman Breshears and seconded by Alderman Johnson. Passed 4-0

The financial report was presented by Treasurer Sandy Cook. End of March balances for each account were read and the April Financial Report was reviewed. A motion to approve the April Financial Report was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Street Supervisor Marlin Evans reported that the department has been pulling gravel from the ditches onto the roads, cleaning out culverts, and grading roads. The department has advertised for bids to chip and seal Dorothy Road and Bewley Road.

Police Chief Ken Howard reported 15 citizen calls, 2 assists for other agencies, 7 citations, 19 warning citations, 3 alarm calls, 1 accident, 5 arrests, 8 felony and misdemeanor reports filed, 3 warrants served and 15 complaint reports.

Fire Chief Don Rosson reported 4 medical calls and 1 vehicle accident. The city was recently notified that the WAPPD written FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) application was not selected for funding. The fire department has applied for 2 additional grants.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Spring cleanup for the community has been scheduled for April 21, 2018. Two 30 yard dumpsters will be placed inside the red gate beside the fire department. Gates will open at 7 a.m. and will remain open until the dumpsters are full or 5 p.m., whichever occurs first. A list of prohibited items will be provided. Only non-commercial personal household items will be accepted. A pallet will be placed near the dumpsters for recyclable electronics. Scrap metal will be accepted and

sold to a recycler. Funds received from the scrap metal will be deposited in the City Street fund.

A special council meeting is scheduled for April 24 at 6:00 p.m. to open bids for the chip and seal of Dorothy and Bewley Roads.

Mr. Randy Grayson of 504 Neal Road asked about the order selection of the roads for chip and seal. Mayor Isenhower stated it was based on number of residences on each road and approved by the council. Mr. Grayson suggested that Lucian Wood Road was travelled by more citizens.

Mr. Wayne Bentley of 9429 Cedarville Road presented a petition of 56 signatures requesting the repeal of Ordinance # 2017-12-19-1, driveway drainage culverts. The City Attorney will examine the petition and give the council a legal opinion on how to proceed.

Mr. Tommy Tucker of 1327 Deer Trail asked the council to consider an ordinance to make it illegal to raise animals for fighting purposes.

Mr. Grayson also expressed the desire for Ordinance # 2017-12-19-1 to be repealed. Alderman McClendon suggested the citizens study the Ordinance and bring suggestions of changes to the next council meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS - None

NEW BUSINESS

Considerable hail damage has been reported on City property by the Municipal League's Insurance Adjuster: City Hall –\$15,000, Park Pavilion – \$12,300, and Fire Station - \$28,700. Municipal League Insurance deductible for the city is \$7500 per event. The City can change the future deductible to \$5000 per event for structures for a higher annual premium. Discussion was tabled until the May council meeting.

With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0
