CITY OF CEDARVILLE CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES June 19, 2018

The regular monthly City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Mark Isenhower after he declared that a quorum was present. A moment of silence was followed by the pledge of allegiance. Council members present were Alderman Johnson, Alderman Odom, Alderman McClendon and Alderman Breshears.

A motion to approve the May regular monthly meeting minutes was made by Alderman Odom and seconded by Alderman McClendon. Passed 4-0

The financial report was presented by Treasurer Sandy Cook. End of May balances for each account were read and the June Financial Report was reviewed. A motion to approve the June Financial Report was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Street Supervisor Marlin Evans reported that the County Road Department will begin the chip and seal of Neal Road. All culverts on Neal Road have been replaced and an eight inch gravel base has been laid. The City will be renting a water truck and driver for \$300 per day to assist in the chip and seal process. The Mayor has contacted Arkhola and arranged a discount price of \$9.30 per ton for gravel and \$4.40 per ton to haul. The contractor hired to chip and seal Dorothy Road and Bewley Road is expected within the next 2 to 3 weeks.

Police Chief Ken Howard reported 19 citizen calls, 2 assist to other agencies, 24 citations, 17 warning citations, 1 alarm call, 1 accident, 2 arrests, 6 felony and misdemeanor reports filed, and 19 complaint reports.

Fire Chief Don Rosson was absent due to family obligations.

NEW BUSINESS

The City phones, faxes and internet are currently supplied by Cox Communications. Mayor Isenhower has obtained a quote from AT&T for the same services that is substantially lower. Alderman McClendon stated that internet service from AT&T is much slower than Cox internet service. It was suggested that Cox Communications be contacted to possibly negotiate lower billing. Discussion was tabled until the July meeting.

The Police Department evidence room is being relocated to the closet just outside the Treasurer's office. It provides more space and security locks are being installed.

Mayor Isenhower proposed an upgraded high definition security camera system with an Eight Channel High Definition three TB DVR for City Hall. A total of seven day/night cameras would be installed with one having pan, tilt, and zoom capability. The system includes a 3 year parts and labor warranty and no monthly charge. A motion to purchase and install a new security camera system was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0

With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Johnson. Passed 4-0
