CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
June 21, 2022

The regular monthly City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Mark Isenhower after he declared that a quorum was present. A moment of silence was followed by the pledge of allegiance. Council members present were Alderman Odom, Alderman Breshears, Alderman McClendon and Alderman Johnson.

A motion to approve the May regular monthly meeting minutes was made by Alderman Odom and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0

The financial report was presented by Treasurer Sandy Cook. End of May balances for each account were read and the June Financial Report was reviewed. A motion to approve the June Financial Report was made by Alderman Odom and seconded by Alderman McClendon. Passed 4-0

Alderman Odom made a motion to add the amount of \$1455 from the police department fundraiser to the police department budget and send a thank you to Hometown Publishing Inc. for orchestrating the fundraiser. The motion was seconded by Alderman McClendon. Passed 4-0

#### DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Grounds Supervisor Kenneth Brenton reported that the department has been grading the city roads and are repairing the chip and sealed roads where needed. A discussion was held discussing the possible purchase of a sickle to help clean roadsides.

Police Chief Ken Howard reported 51 citizen calls, 11 assists to other agencies, 26 citations, 16 warning citations, 0 alarms answered, 3 accidents, 3 arrests, 10 felonies and misdemeanor reports filed, and 3 warrants served.

Fire Chief Cody Cooper reported 4 fire calls, returning to one house 4 times, and 9 medical calls. The department was also called out to remove a tree from the roadway and 1 tractor fire.

## NEW BUSINESS

Ordinance # 2022-06-21-01, to allow the city to purchase a used truck for the Street Department from an elected official, was read by Treasurer Sandy Cook.

A motion to waive the reading rules and read only once was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Roll Call vote: Alderman Breshears – yes, Alderman Johnson – yes, Alderman McClendon – yes, Alderman Odom – abstain. Passed 3-0, 1 abstain

A motion to approve Ordinance # 2022-06-21-01 to purchase a 2004 Dodge 2500 4WD truck VIN # 3D7KU28C44G110919 from North Town Auto Sales owned by Alderman Odom was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Alderman McClendon expressed a big Thank You to North Town Sales for the excellent deal given to the City for the Street truck. The purchase is to be paid from the Street Department account. Passed 3-0 Alderman Odom abstained.

A motion to declare Ordinance # 2022-06-21-01 an emergency was made by Alderman Breshears and seconded by Alderman Johnson. Roll Call Vote: Alderman Breshears – yes, Alderman Johnson – yes, Alderman McClendon – yes, Alderman Odom – abstain. Passed 3-0, 1 abstain

Bids were presented for a 2.5 ton heat pump rated at 14 Seer for the Fire Department. The bids were as follows:



A motion to accept the bid from Keenan Winters for \$5059.00 was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0


A discussion was held concerning adding two truck bays to the existing fire station. A motion to hire an engineer to draw the specs for the additional two bays and then advertise for bids was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Odom. Passed 4-0

Mayor Isenhower discussed the purchase of three new Dodge Durango SUVs for the Police Department at State bid pricing using ARPA funds. An exact price is not available until the dealer is able to order them. A motion to order 3 Dodge Durango police cars at State bid, when they become available, was made by Alderman Odom and seconded by Alderman McClendon. Passed 4-0

With no further business to discuss, a motion was made to adjourn by Alderman Odom and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0
