

CITY OF CEDARVULLE
CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES
October 6, 2020

The special City Council meeting was called to order by Mayor Mark Isenhower at the City Park after he declared that a quorum was present. Council members present were Alderman McClendon, Alderman Breshears Alderman Odom and Alderman Johnson.

There was no unfinished business to discuss.

Mayor Isenhower thoroughly explained and answered questions concerning the de-annexation issue on the November 3rd election ballot. There are two areas the City has proposed for de-annexation to be returned to County status.

The first area consists of Hightower Road and Millpond Road from the intersection with Hightower Road east to the county line. This area is highly travelled predominantly by county residents and very few city residents. The de-annexation of this section will only affect 5 houses total. All citizens affected by this section have been contacted and are in agreement for de-annexation.

The second area is a section of Creekside Way where Weber Creek floods and destroys a bridge during heavy rains. The bridge is at the border of the City limits and all citizens living past the bridge are County citizens. The de-annexation of this section will only affect 2 houses. The citizens affected by this section have been contacted as well.


State Street turn back revenue received by the City is based on population and currently is \$65.60 per person per year. There are only 11 citizens on Hightower/Millpond Roads and 4 citizens on Creekside Way that will be affected. The Millpond section is approximately .75 miles, Hightower Road is approximately .4 of a mile and Creekside Way is approximately .23 miles. The maintenance cost of the two sections marked for de-annexation and used primarily by county residents far outweighs any revenue received for the areas.

Mayor Isenhower provided copies of maps indicating the sections for de-annexation along with a letter explaining in detail for anyone who wanted a copy.

With no further business to conduct, a motion to adjourn was made by Alderman McClendon and seconded by Alderman Breshears. Passed 4-0
